School Update THIS MONTH AT RYDERS GREEN



At the start of each school year we hold a vote in each class to select the new School Councillors. Part of their role is to be the voice for the pupils and help shape decisions made in school. To kick-start their new role, we took our KS2 School Council to London at the start of the school year. We were able to visit the House of Parliament and the House of Lords and see a real live debate! The School Council also took part in a workshop to understand how laws are made and then finished our visit with a Q&A session with the MP for West Bromwich - Sarah Coombes.

In school, we are always looking to improve further and see how we can make the most of all of the pupils 'one chance' here at Ryders Green. While there are lots of little things that might change in school across the year, below are the five main priorities that we are working on together:

- Thinking of new exciting ways to teach writing using 'The Write Stuff' approach.

All pupils take part in weekly PE sessions in school. In order to maximise the lesson time for PE, children are invited to come into school in their PE kit on the day when their PE lesson is taking place.

School PE kit consists of plain black shorts/leggings/jogging bottoms that should have no logos or additional detail and a plain white t-shirt. Pupils can also wear trainers on their PE days. 
