

School Ulbaate THIS MONTH AT RYDERS GREEN



Year 3 had an incredible visit to the Think Tank in Birmingham this month. The visit allowed them to develop their knowledge and understanding linked to their learning in Science all around friction. The pupils represented the school so well across the day and we have loved hearing about all they have learnt. 'I was able to do a real investigation!' remarked one pupil.

During this term, Year 6 have been learning all about World War II. The pupils visited the Royal Air Force Museum at Cosford this month where they were able to learn all about the vital role air defence played during WW2. The information they gained will be vital in supporting their exploration of the topic in school.





Our Year 1 pupils stepped back in time and immersed themselves in some local history this week. The pupils visited the Black Country Living Museum where they were able to look at how people in our area used to live and think about how it is different to how we live today. We look forward to seeing their assembly later this term.

AT RGPS

DID YOU KNOW - just 40% of persistently absent (PA) children in KS2 achieved expected KS2 standards, compared with 84% of pupils who regularly attended school.

When you register your child at school, you have a legal duty to ensure your child attends that school regularly.

This means that your child must attend every day that the school is open, unless:

- Your child is too ill to attend that day.
- You have asked in advance and been given permission by the school for your child to be absent on that day due to exceptional circumstances.
- Your child cannot attend school on that day because it is a day you are taking part in religious observance
- Your local authority is responsible for arranging your child's transport to school and it is not available on that day or has not been provided yet; or
- You are a gypsy/traveller family with no fixed abode, and you are required to travel for work that day meaning your child cannot attend their usual school. In most circumstances, however, your child is required to attend another school temporarily during such absences.

These are the only circumstances where schools can permit your child to be absent.

Please remember to contact school if your child is unwell and you are unsure if they are able to attend. In line with NHS guidance, they can still attend school if they have a cough, runny nose or a sore throat.

Next month we will be holding a Phonics Workshop for our parents in Year 1. It is a fantastic opportunity to learn more about phonics and how it is taught in school. As our pupils in Year 4 will have found out, times tables is hot on the agenda! For all of our families in Year 4 there will be a meeting for you to come along to so you can find out more about the Multiplication Tables Check. Details will be sent home with pupils shortly.





PC Adam Lane will be joining us from West Midlands Police next month. He is going to speak to the children about how they can keep themselves safe, especially with the dark nights during autumn and winter.

In May 2025, our Year 6 pupils will be sitting their SATs assessments. The papers will include Reading, SPAG and Maths. In November, we will be holding a meeting so you can find out about the work being completing in school and ways you can support at home.





All pupils take part in weekly PE sessions in school. In order to maximise the lesson time for PE, children are invited to come into school in their PE kit on the day when their PE lesson is taking place.

School PE kit consists of plain black shorts/leggings/jogging bottoms that should have no logos or additional detail and a plain white t-shirt. Pupils can also wear trainers on their PE days. Next half term, clubs will be running on w/c 11th, 18th, 25th November and 2nd and 9th December. SIPS Music Clubs (Monday - drumming, Tuesday-recorders/brass band, Wednesday-violin) will be running every week during the half term.

By attending after school clubs pupils are able to gain hours towards Children's University. The hours are combined week on week to build towards very special graduation ceremonies. At the end of the school year, those pupils with enough hours will even get the chance to graduate at the University of Wolverhampton.
